

## Standard 4 - Patient Problem List/Chronic conditions

Having structured information about a patient's problem list/chronic conditions is important in supporting population health initiatives, as well as doing risk analysis on a patient population (e.g. risk of admission/readmission, risk of cancer, risk of cardiovascular disease etc). It is now required that all facilities capture chronic condition/chronic problem information in the format outlined in the table below.

This in turn will enhance the quality of care and improve the accuracy of analytics, risk assessment and better identify populations for disease registries.

The Ministry of health And Prevention has recently procured an UAE wide SNOMED clinical terminologies license which means that all healthcare facilities will have access to this clinical terminology codeset. The SNOMED Codeset can be accessed from [Health Information Exchange standards \(doh.gov.ae\)](https://doh.gov.ae/Health-Information-Exchange-standards) using the credentials of your facility.
